Bishop Iffert has declared that this Friday, January 21, be observed as a Day of Prayer and Penance for Life to mark the anniversary of the Supreme Court's legalization of abortion in our country. On that day, every parish in our diocese will expose the Blessed Sacrament for a period of Eucharistic adoration, so that we can gather to pray for an end to abortion and for all those affected by it, especially the millions of unborn children whose lives have been unjustly cut short. Here at St. Joseph our period of adoration will begin at 8:30 a.m. (after daily Mass) and conclude with benediction at 11:30 a.m. There is a sign-up sheet in the vestibule of the church for halfhour time timeslots throughout the morning. We'd like to have two people present at all times, so that the Blessed Sacrament is never alone. So, please consider stopping out on Friday, January 24, to offer a little of your time to be with the Lord and pray for this important cause.
