Merry Christmas! On the great Solemnity of the Lord's Nativity, we celebrate the birth of Christ so many centuries ago in Bethlehem, when a new light shone at last upon the darkness of our fallen world. ### **2025 DPAA – November Update**

Your DPAA support strengthens vital diocesan services and ministries. Your generosity reflects our unity in Christ and gratitude for God's blessings. Please join the parish households who have already pledged by making your gift soon. As a reminder our parish goal is \$57,600. **So far, our parish pledges total \$70,935.** This year, the amount raised above our goal will go towards replacing the school roof. Thank you for your faithful stewardship. God bless you for your generosity!

### **St. Vincent de Paul**

We would like to update you on how our chapter has supported the community this year.

For the fiscal year ending 9/30/25, our conference has helped on 44 cases and assisted 125 people in our St. Joseph conference area and at the Newport Scholar house. The Newport Scholar provides temporary housing for single mothers as they attend school to acquire job skills in nursing, social work, and cosmetology. Our conference has provided a total of \$12,575 for direct aid (rent, utilities, grocery/gas gift cards) and \$8,172 for food from our pantry and SVDP store vouchers (clothing, furniture, and household items) in our conference area and the Scholar House.

Our conference has also made approx. 30 elderly/sick visits at the Seasons Nursing home and parishioners /residential visits; seeing over 100 people. Our parish has generously contributed \$13,118 monetary, in addition to grocery, cleaning and hygiene products donated.

Newport is in what is called the "No Help" area because there is no active SVDP conference present. Our conference tends to their needs for assistance exclusively. Our conference case workers

have also made 95 home visits in the Newport "No Help" area, not counting the Scholar House. We have assisted over 230 people through these visits. Our visits require at least two case workers. Through these Newport "No Help" visits, we provided direct aid, store vouchers and gift cards totaling \$29,737. Almost all this assistance was paid for by the SVDP N.KY Council, not our conference.

Active SVDP members are Tim McGrath- President, Steve Fay- Vice President, Don Heeb- Treasurer, Regina Murphy- Secretary, Tom Corman, Ann Fay, Megan Heeb, Pat Schwegmann, and Wanda Sendelbach. We are all caseworkers and home visitors. If anyone has an interest and would like to go with us on a home or nursing home visit to observe what we do, please contact any of us.
