This week, on February 3rd, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century and was arrested because of his refusal to offer sacrifice to pagan idols, eventually being tortured and beheaded. As he was being carried off to prison, a mother brought to St. Blaise her son who was choking to death on a fishbone, upon which the child was cured by the prayers of the saint.

It's for this reason that St. Blaise has come to be venerated as the patron saint of those suffering from ailments of the throat and that the special blessing of throats is offered on his feast day—and which is also being offered here at the conclusion of Masses this weekend. As we ask him to preserve us from illness, let's also ask the Lord for the boldness to follow St. Blaise's example by enduring courageously whatever comes our way and by using our voices to proclaim His Gospel at all times, so that all may come to know the salvation that Christ has won for us.


Soup may be simple, but it plays an important role in helping families put warm, quick, and nutritious meals on the table when it matters most.
