## **Parish News**

This weekend is the annual DPAA Commitment Weekend. ### **Stations of the Cross and Confessions**

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed in the church on every Monday of Lent beginning at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will be heard afterwards.

### **Solemnity of the Annunciation**

Friday, March 25, is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, which commemorates the archangel's proclamation to Mary that she would miraculously conceive the Son of God and the Blessed Mother's acceptance of her unique role in God's plan of salvation. A solemnity is the highest ranking category of feast day in the Church's calendar. As such, when a solemnity falls on a Friday, the Church lifts the obligation to abstain from meat on that day (can. 1251). More importantly, the Annunciation reminds us that we too are called to say "Yes" to God's plan for us and to welcome Him into our lives with faith and love, as did our Blessed Mother.
