Parish News

In our Gospel reading this Sunday, we hear about our Lord's visit to the home of two sisters, Martha, and Mary. While Martha busies herself with serving, Mary sits at the Lord's feet listening to Him speak. Martha complains that Mary isn't assisting her and asks Jesus to tell Mary to help her. We can sympathize with Martha—she wants to be a good host—so perhaps the Lord's response to this squabble is a surprise: “Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her.” The problem is not that Martha is busy, but that her incessant activity is attempting to divert Mary's attention away from Christ.

Many of us live busy lives and have countless responsibilities and concerns and activities that demand our time and attention. There's nothing wrong with that; in fact, many of our duties are a real moral obligation. But the challenge is not to let them pull us away from “the better part,” the one thing necessary: our relationship with Christ. The most important way we do that is by prioritizing our time with Him at Sunday Mass and not letting other activities keep us away from that sacred time consecrated to God. But we're also meant to keep our relations with Him front and center every day and every moment. So, let's ask Him to help us to always live in His presence and to walk with Him through all of our work and activity, so that we never lose sight of the better part, the one thing necessary.
