## Parish News

The month of November, which we've just begun with All Saints Day and All Souls Day, has been traditionally dedicated to praying for the faithful departed. To be sure, it's humbling to be reminded that our earthly lives will come to a conclusion at a time and in a manner that are not chosen by us. At the same time, as a people of faith, we are filled with hope, because death reminds us that we are merely sojourners here on earth and we have a far greater and more glorious home that awaits us in Heaven. As St. Paul says in his First Letter to the Thessalonians, we "may not grieve as others do who have no hope," because "the Lord Himself will descend from Heaven with a cry of command, with the archangel's call, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise" (1 Thes 4: 13, 16).

This radical hope in the face of death is rooted in the historical fact of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Because He is truly risen, the new life that He offers us is no empty metaphor. It is real, indeed, far more real than the passing world that we presently inhabit. Those who have died in Christ are not merely memories destined to fade away; they truly live and are destined for eternity. The Church expresses this confident hope in the Preface for Masses for the Dead: "Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in Heaven."

This is why the Church urges us to pray for the faithful departed. Our relationship with our family and friends who have died is not ended, but it has changed. Now that relationship is expressed in prayer and now we are reunited in a particularly important way in the Mass, as we look forward in hope to the day when we will see them again and together sing God's praises eternally.
