Parish News

Our readings at Mass this Sunday emphasize the great importance of our persistence in prayer. In the first reading, we hear about Abraham repeatedly begging God to show mercy to the people of Sodom and Gomorrah. And in the reading from Gospel, the Lord tells a parable about a man who goes to his friend's house in the middle of the night to ask for bread. He says, "I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence."

Our prayer is meant to align our minds and hearts with God's desires for us. It's meant to open our hearts to His plans for us. And that's not a change that happens overnight. That's why we have to *persist* in prayer and allow it to become a habit that permeates everything we do. It's only in this staying with the Lord that we are gradually transformed by His grace. Of course, there are a lot of distractions and it's easy to get caught up in the here-and-now. But the Lord also sends us signs of His closeness and Providence every day, if we strive to look at our lives with the eyes of faith. So, let's pray that we might be more attentive to those signs from God, those small blessings that surround us day in and day out, so that we may turn our minds and hearts to Him more and more, and so stay with Him always.
