This weekend is the annual DPAA Announcement Weekend. As you know, the Diocesan Parish Annual Appeal supports a variety of ministries and services that bring the love and mercy of Christ to people in need throughout our community. The DPAA also provides us with a great opportunity to support our parish, because all funds that we raise above our parish goal are returned back to our parish without any diocesan assessment being taken out. This year we will be using our DPAA rebate to help pay for replacing the roof of our school building.

Our parish goal this year is \$57,600. This goal is \$5,800 higher than last year's goal, which we met and far exceeded, so I am confident that your generosity will enable us to do so once again. Even more than the total amount raised, I've been very proud of our parish's high participation rate in this annual appeal, which is a testament to our parishioners' widespread dedication to our parish. If you haven't been able to give to the DPAA in the past, I encourage you to please make a gift this year, knowing that any contribution—no matter the amount—will be a blessing for our parish and for those served by the DPAA-funded ministries.
