Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is this coming Wednesday, February 22. **Our Masses with the distribution of ashes will be at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.** We will not have our regular Eucharistic adoration on Ash Wednesday, but confessions will still be heard from 6-6:45 PM as usual. There's no better way for us to begin this sacred time of purification and renewal than by receiving the Lord's grace in the sacraments.

As a part of your Lenten devotion, please also consider joining us on the Mondays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. to pray the **Stations of the Cross**. Confessions will be heard afterwards.

As a reminder, **the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat; Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence.** The rules for the obligations of fasting and abstinence are as follows:

- Catholics from age 18 through 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is allowed on these days, as well as two snacks that together are not equal to a full meal.
- Catholics who are 14 or older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

Please know that you're all in my prayers in a special way as we enter into the season of Lent. It's my hope that through the discipline of this sacred time the Lord will help all of us to follow Him more closely and share in His divine life more fully.
