Parish News

This Sunday we enter into the part of Lent traditionally known as **Passiontide**. During these final days of Lent, the Church increasingly turns her attention to the approaching Passion and Death of Christ. For centuries, the Gospel reading for Mass on the 5th Sunday of Lent (known as Passion Sunday) was the account of Jesus' confrontation with the Pharisees in the Temple, in which He asserted His divinity and the crowd picked up stones to throw at Him (Jn 8: 46-59). This incident is now spread across the Gospel readings of the weekday Masses during the 5th Week of Lent, thus presenting the controversy surrounding Jesus' claim to be God as the source of the hostility that would lead eventually to the Cross. This passage from the Gospel concludes with the line: "So they took up stones to throw at Him; but Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the Temple" (Jn 8: 59). It was this hiding of Jesus that gave rise to the tradition of veiling the crosses and images of the Lord in churches throughout the final weeks of Lent. The images of the saints are also veiled during this time, since "a servant is not greater than his master" (Jn 13: 16). In this way, the Church enters more deeply into the Passion of the Lord, when His power and glory were in a sense veiled by the suffering and weakness He embraced on the Cross. But we go with Him to Calvary knowing that "on this mountain He will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations" (Is 25: 7). In His Resurrection, the glory of His divinity will shine through the veil of our humanity and the Cross will stand revealed as the Tree of Life. As we enter into these final days of Lent, let's unite ourselves all the more to the Lord's Cross, so that we may share all the more in the new life that He has won for us.
