This Wednesday, September 21, we celebrate the feast of Saint Matthew, the apostle and evangelist. The story of Matthew's conversion is an incredible testament to the power of God's grace. Matthew was very famously a tax collector, a hated occupation because the tax collectors took money for themselves beyond what they were supposed to collect. And in Matthew's case, the situation was even worse: he was taking money from his fellow Jews to hand over to the occupying Roman forces. In the pursuit of material gain, Matthew had become a corrupt man despised by his society.

But one day, Jesus walked past Matthew's customs post and looked at him. But He didn't look at him as a thief or a traitor, but instead with a gaze full of mercy and love. He looked past Matthew's failures and unworthiness and saw a beloved child of the Father for whom He had come to give up His own life. And that divine mercy totally transforms Matthew. He leaves behind his old life of sin and follows Christ. He accompanied the Lord throughout His public ministry, preached the Gospel, and at last gave up his life in martyrdom. His conversion is a reminder that no one is outside the reach of God's mercy. In the Eucharist, Jesus continues to enter our midst and look at us with love. Let's pray that we might respond to His mercy as St. Matthew did by leaving our sins behind and following the Lord wherever He leads us.
