Parish News

Continuing her celebration of Easter, the Church observes this day as Divine Mercy Sunday. The Divine Mercy devotion was first promoted in Poland by Saint Faustina in the 1930s and the Second Sunday of Easter was designated as the Sunday of Divine Mercy by Pope St. John Paul II in the year 2000. So, in terms of the life of the Church, this celebration is still practically brand new. But, at the same time, God's mercy lies at the very heart of the Easter mystery. St. John Paul II said in a homily that God's mercy "is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the Risen Christ and offers to humanity." In the Resurrection of Christ, the mercy of God has proven itself stronger than even the worst of human sin.

And we're able to take part in that victory of life over death, mercy over sin, in our own lives still today. We experience it especially in the sacrament of confession, in which God's mercy continues to triumph over our sins and swallow them up in the greatness of His love. We experience it in the grace that He gives us in the Eucharist, which enables us to rise above our weaknesses and live a new life of holiness and faith. As we continue to celebrate the Good News of the Lord's Resurrection, let's renew our trust in His mercy and allow it to continue to raise us up more and more into God's own life.

St. Vincent de Paul

St. Vincent de Paul sees Christ in the face of the poor.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul has been active in Northern Kentucky since 1923. The oldest conference is Holy Cross Parish in Latonia that began in 1923. In the coming weeks, we will be sharing more information about St. Vincent de Paul as we begin the process of beginning a Conference at St. Joseph parish.

We invite you to pray about becoming a member and to take part in the Mission to “see the face of Christ in the face of the poor.”

The Conference is the basic unity of the Society. It is made up of a group of volunteers called to grow in holiness through person-to-person service. The members of the Society are called “Vincentians.” The mission is to grow together in spirituality and friendship by giving person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering.

The core of our Society’s work is done by over 540 members in 29 St. Vincent de Paul Conferences across Northern Kentucky. The home visit is a trademark of our Society through person-to-person service. Conferences assist people with a wide range of needs. They may provide rental assistance or help with utility bills, food, clothing, houseware items, and furniture. Some conferences have their own food pantry. But more important than the physical aid given, the conferences provide friendship and spiritual support to the people they help.

How can you get involved?

On the weekend of May 14 and 15, representatives from St. Vincent de Paul Council will speak at all Masses and give an invitation to learn more about getting involved in a Conference here at St. Joseph parish.
