Our readings at Mass this weekend make the point very clearly that we do not exist in isolation from one another. In the words of St. Paul, we're all meant to become members of Christ's mystical body, to form one spiritual organism, so we don't have the luxury of retreating into ourselves and abandoning others to their fate. The Lord's message to the Prophet Ezekiel in the first reading today is that if he doesn't speak out to warn the wicked, then he'll be responsible for their death. In other words, since Ezekiel has heard the Word of God, he has to share it.

By virtue of our baptism, all of us have been called to that prophetic vocation, no less than Ezekiel was. It's not something that we can just leave to others. When we see a person lost and suffering, we can't be indifferent and say, "That's your problem," and go on with our lives. On the contrary, I have to acknowledge that it's very much my problem and that I have a responsibility to bring the light of God's truth and love into that person's life as best I can.

So, let's pray this week that the Lord will strengthen us to bear witness to Him and become the face of His mercy and love for the people He sends into our lives.
