Our Gospel reading this Sunday revolves around a conversation between Christ and a young man who asks Him, “Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” Insofar as we’ve all been created to share God’s life forever, this is the central question of all of our lives. The Lord’s answer is rather straightforward: walk the path of sacrificial love by keeping God’s commandments and serving those in need. But the man who asked the question goes away sad, because, as sincere as he might be in his desire to seek God, there are apparently other things that he’s seeking first. And so, he finds himself unable to let go of his “many possessions” in order to follow the path traced out for him by Jesus. Of course, we can sympathize with the man’s fears and concerns. It’s a very human temptation to turn inwards in a spirit of self-preservation, rather than turning outwards to give ourselves away in love. But as Christians we are called to follow Christ and to be conformed to His life of sacrificial love. The young man in the Gospel went away from Jesus sad, and so it always goes when we cling to ourselves rather than to Him. So, let’s pray this week for the grace to follow the Lord and to allow Him to bring us to the joy that He alone can give.
