Parish News

Our first reading this Sunday recounts the details of an ancient battle between the Israelites and the Amalekites. It might seem curious that the Church asks us to consider this obscure historical conflict, until we hear about the way that Moses turned the tide of the war. He climbed to the top of the hill overlooking the battle and raised his hands in prayer to God. And Israel was victorious in the fight as long as Moses prayed, but when he grew tired and his hands dropped the fighting turned against them. And so, we see that ultimately it is not men of violence or weapons of war that direct the course of human history, but rather God, the Lord of Hosts, the King of the Universe. We can be so quick to place our trust in those who are great in the eyes of the world, but the Christian knows that God has the last word and that He works so often in ways that are small, quiet, and simple. The Lord asks His disciples in the Gospel reading this Sunday, “Will not God secure the rights of His chosen ones who call out to Him day and night?” Indeed, let us place our faith in Him and remain close to Him in prayer, trusting always in the power of His divine love to save us and raise us up.

KY Constitutional Amendment #2

When matters of public policy affect the dignity of the human person, especially those who are most vulnerable and in need of our protection, the Church has a duty to speak out with a clear voice.

On November 8th, Kentuckians will go to the polls once again. Some of the choices facing us this year are two proposed amendments to our State Constitution. The second of these is of paramount importance, as it will explicitly affirm that the Kentucky Constitution contains no right to either abortion or its governmental funding.

The Kentucky Catholic Bishops are therefore strongly encouraging all Kentuckians to go to the polls on election day this year, turn over their ballots, and vote YES for Amendment #2, which is located at the very bottom of the back page.
