KY Constitutional Amendment #2

When matters of public policy affect the dignity of the human person, especially those who are most vulnerable and in need of our protection, the Church has a duty to speak out with a clear voice.

On November 8th, Kentuckians will go to the polls once again. Some of the choices facing us this year

are two proposed amendments to our State Constitution. The second of these is of paramount importance, as it will explicitly affirm that the Kentucky Constitution contains no right to either abortion or its governmental funding.

The Kentucky Catholic Bishops are therefore strongly encouraging all Kentuckians to go to the polls on election day this year, turn over their ballots, and vote YES for Amendment #2, which is located at the very bottom of the back page.
